I personally thank you St. John Town Council and St. John Metropolitan Police Commission for your genuine support of me and the St. John Police Department in 2011.





TOTAL MILEAGE -- 2007 - 2011









INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION - YEAR 2011

In 2011, the St. John Police Department Investigations Division was assigned a total of 118 cases. Of those 118 cases, 36 of those cases resulted in charges being filed on the suspects with the Lake County Prosecutors Office, and 25 suspects being arrested. This relates to 51% of the crimes investigated by the Investigations Division were closed by either charges being filed and/or actual arrests of the suspects involved in the crimes. In comparison, the percentage in 2010 was 43% of the crimes investigated by the Investigation Division were closed by either charges being filed and/or actual arrests of the suspects involved in the crimes. The percentage increase is due in part to the recent technological improvements which were implemented into the Investigations Division, namely Critical Reach and Leadsonline, and also through the improved relationships which, in turn, provided a better sharing of information between the area police departments and the St. John Police Investigations Division.
